- 4. To foster a sense of harmony and balance in personal and professional lives.


Program Highlights:



The formation and phases of the Moon.


The significance of lunar exploration in understanding the universe.

An interactive session followed, where participants shared their ideas and queries about conservation practices. The exchange of perspectives enriched the discussion and motivated students to take proactive steps.




The Principal delivered the opening remarks, emphasizing the importance of remembering history to prevent its tragic repetition.

Programme Highlights:


The event commenced with a moment of silence to pay tribute to the lives lost in the Nagasaki bombing, creating a reflective and solemn atmosphere.

Both students and staff participated with enthusiasm, creating an atmosphere of camaraderie and fun.


Traditional Attire:

Winners of the events were awarded medals and certificates, celebrating their effort and excellence.


Health & Sports Club Initiatives:

To reflect on the importance of teaching as a noble profession and its impact on society.



The program concluded with a collective pledge by students and staff to take small yet impactful steps in their daily lives to protect the environment and preserve the ozone layer.



To commemorate the life and legacy of Mahatma Gandhi.



These performances were met with enthusiastic applause, showcasing the students' dedication to preserving Kerala's cultural art forms.





Highlighting contemporary human rights issues, he urged students to be vigilant against discrimination, inequality, and injustice in society.



Talk by Mr. Palliyara Sreedharan:


