Mr. Manoj K V, an experienced life skill trainer, delivered an engaging and motivational talk that captured the attention of the audience.

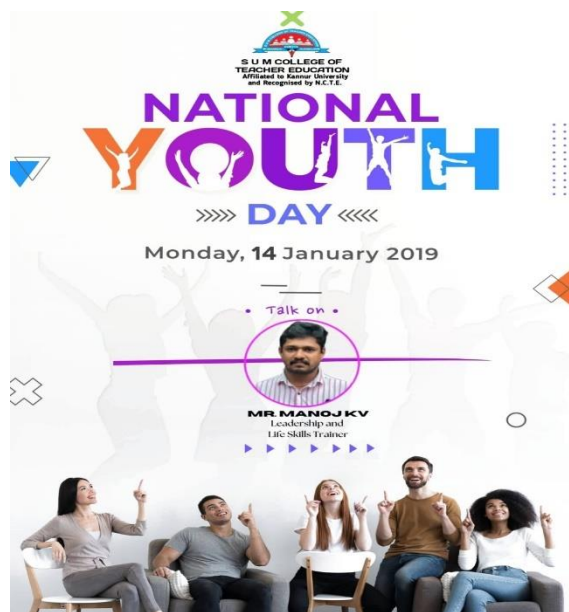
He emphasized the importance of self-confidence, resilience, and critical thinking in achieving personal and professional success.

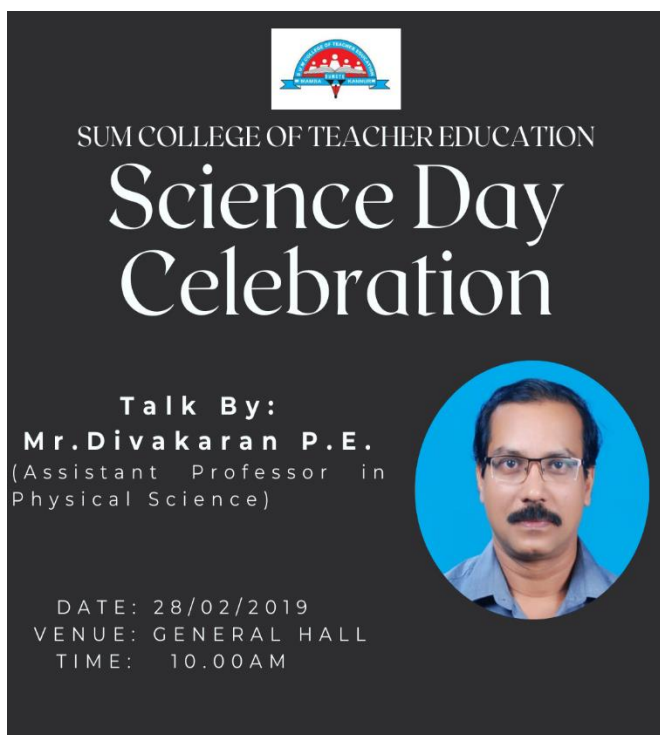

To highlight the significance of water as a vital resource for life.

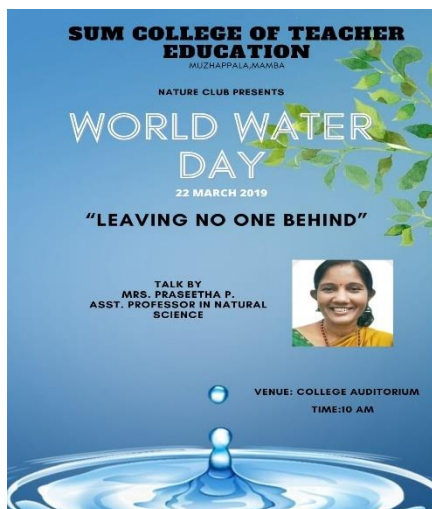

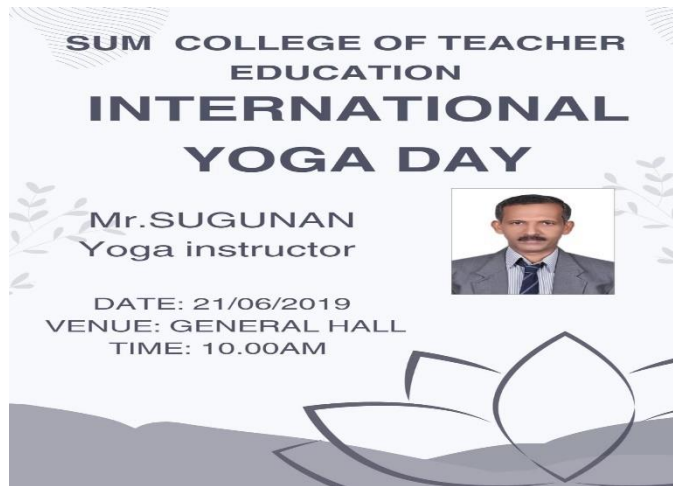


17. International Yoga Day Celebration

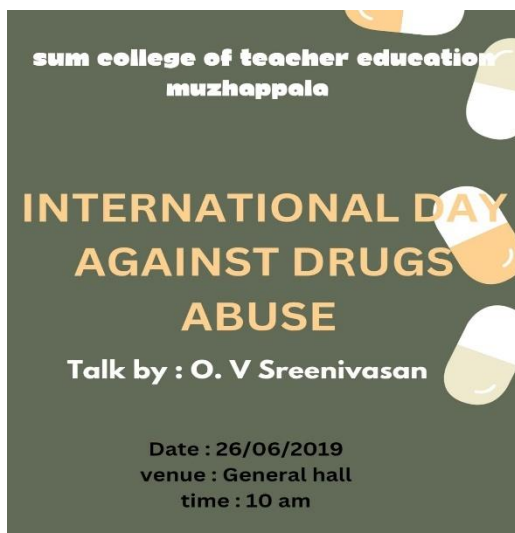
18. International Day Against Drug Abuse and Illegal Trafficking
