Date: 01/01/2025 Venue: Amalabhavan



Parents were encouraged to support the college by fostering student participation and academic performance, contributing to the NAAC process.


Infrastructure and Academic Updates:


10. ALUMNI MEETING

Audience:


The event was attended by a large number of students from various departments, all eager to learn more about the electoral system and its importance in the democratic framework.
